## **Risk Management Policy**

## Adopted by the OANS Board of Directors 14 March 2022

The Orienteering Association of Nova Scotia is committed to ensuring that all its members and participants are provided a safe experience for orienteering. We recognize that being active in nature has inherent risk. We have taken the following measures to reduce this risk to our participants.

Specifically the OANS:

- 1. Use event Officials certified to Orienteering Canada standards which include safety considerations in course design, controlling and site preparation.
- 2. Provide Safety Briefing and Emergency Action Plan templates for use by Event Directors.
- 3. Provide beginner briefs at every event to increase the knowledge and understanding of orienteering for first time participants.
- 4. Use tick warning on maps in areas known to contain ticks and post Tick Check Basics at event sites.
- 5. Carry liability insurance through Orienteering Canada, see Orienteering Nova Scotia Insurance Policy for more details.
- 6. Follow all health directives and guidelines from local authorities and Orienteering Canada regarding pandemic protocols.
