The land now known as **Beacon Hill Park** was originally set aside as a protected area by Sir James Douglas, governor of the Colony of Vancouver Island in 1858. In its previous history, it was part of the lands once used by the Songhees First Nations. Evidence of burial cairns still remain to this day. In 1882, the land was officially made a municipal park in the City of Victoria, and given its present name. The name is derived from a small hill overlooking the Strait, upon which once stood navigational masts which served as beacons.

Take a quiet stroll in Beacon Hill Park to enjoy its wonderful sites and rich history. Visit each location shown on the map to answer the questions noted below.
